Beach Bonfires

Beach bonfires can be a fun way to spend time with friends and family but they need to be carefully managed and supervised, and held in a safe and permitted place. Here is a guideline to beach bonfires in the Whakatāne District.

A written fire permit is required for <u>all</u> beach bonfires Fire permit applications are FREE Download the fire permit application form from **www.whakatane.govt.nz** or collect one from our Council offices. Alternatively, call 07 306 0500 to request a fire permit.

BEACH FIRES ARE PROHIBITED AT THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS:



Port Ōhope: Anywhere East of Ōhope Beach TOP 10 Holiday Park right through to the end of Ōhope Spit.

Ōhiwa Harbour: All Council reserves along the harbour margin.

Ōtarawairere: Anywhere between Whakatāne Heads (1a Muriwai Drive) and West End toilets (63 West End Road).

Coastlands: Anywhere East of Piripai Rise (off Bunyan Rd) through to the Whakatāne river entrance.

BONFIRES ARE ALLOWED AT ALL OTHER LOCATIONS FROM:



Ōtamarākau to Piripai: Includes Coastlands, Thornton, Matatā, and Pikowai Beaches **Ōhope Beach:** From the West End public carpark to the end of Ōhope Beach TOP 10 Holiday Park.

The following conditions must be met:

- Fires should not be lit in windy conditions
- You must actively supervise your fire at all times
- Take all rubbish and litter with you
- You must keep your fire at least 10 metres away from beach vegetation or driftwood
- You must extinguish your fire with water when finished

Please be considerate of other beach users **NEVER** cover your bonfire with sand when you leave. This just traps heat and does not extinguish the fire. **NEVER** deposit glass or other rubbish in the bonfire. Sand-covered bonfires, broken glass and aluminium cans are a danger to other beach users – especially children!

IN AN EMERGENCY



In any emergency situation, **phone 111** and give full details of the incident to the emergency services. Be sure to include: clear directions as to your location, how to get there, details of the incident and the number of persons involved.
