THE IMPACT OF THE CRIMINAL RECORDS (CLEAN SLATE) ACT 2004 ON APPLICATIONS FOR MANAGER'S CERTIFICATES UNDER THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL ACT 2012

The Criminal Records (Clean Slate) Act 2004 commenced on Monday 29 November 2004. The Act enables individuals who satisfy all of the eligibility criteria to conceal all f their convictions in most circumstances. It sets a high threshold for eligibility

The general criteria for obtaining the benefits of the `clean slate' scheme are set out below. Section 7 of the Act should be consulted for full information.

The individual must have:

- No convictions within the last seven years;
- Never been sentenced to a custodial sentence (eg imprisonment, corrective training, borstal)
- Never been ordered by a Court during a criminal case to be detained in a hospital due to his/her mental condition, instead of being sentenced
- Paid in full any fine, reparation or costs ordered by the Court in a criminal case;
- Never been indefinitely disqualified from driving under section 65 of the Land Transport Act 1998 or an
 earlier equivalent provision (section 65 relates to mandatory penalties for repeat offences involving use
 of alcohol or drugs
