This means Audit NZ will go over everything with a fine-toothed comb, we'll make the necessary changes and the Council will adopt the full document on Wednesday, 14 July.

Representation review on the horizon

Councils must review their representation arrangements at least once every six years to achieve fair and effective representation. This year we're carrying out a representation review and we'll be asking our communities to help inform Council in its decision making.

On 20 May 2021, Council unanimously voted to introduce Māori wards for the 2022 and 2025 local body elections. The representation review looks at the total number of councillors there should be for a region and the way they're elected. The review involves deciding:

- the number of councillor to be elected for both the general and Māori wards
- whether they're elected from wards or 'at large' across the whole region, or a mix of both
- whether there should be community boards, and if so how many, their names and boundaries and the number of members for each board.
