

Murupara water update

For the last few months, our waters team has been manually dosing the water to manage the safety of the water supply. We acknowledge this way of doing things isn't the greatest in the long-term because it gives variable levels of chlorine across different parts of the network.

Behind the scenes we've been working on an automated dosing system that allows us to regulate the levels a little bit better. This system is now in place and means levels can be set at a minimum, yet sufficient, level to ensure interim protection for you and the wider community.

Community engagement – following the necessary postponement of the planned community hui a few months ago we are now working hard to find an alternative date for the meeting to discuss longer-term options. We are planning for early next year and will let you know once we have a confirmed date and location.
