Kia Kaha projects completed

Two environmental projects funded through the Kia Kaha Whakatāne programme, and managed by the Bay of Plenty Regional Council, have recently been completed.

Wilding pine control along the Rangitāiki River through Murupara and Minginui saw Makov Enterprise contractors clear 1548 trees over approximately 1120 hectares. Four staff involved in this project also took the opportunity to complete their first aid training. A separate contract along the Rangitāiki River at Waiōhau included Waikakariki Ltd contractors dealing to over 400 wilding pine over 73 hectares of native scrub and forest. Two staff from the second project completed first aid training, plus introductory chainsaw courses.

There has also been a range of other works completed in the Murupara and Galatea area, including:

- Concrete mowing strips constructed around Murupara Service Centre playground and Oak Street playground edging.
- Oak Street playground repainted.
- Pest plants cleared along the river reserve between the Murupara fire station and Evans Park.
- General tidy up of Taniwha Reserve.
- Major clean-up of autumn leaf drop and some trees lifted at Aniwhenua Reserve.
- Twenty-seven larch trees were removed from around the Galatea Cemetery, which were then milled into planks by the local community. This timber was used to construct a new timber rail fence around the sides and the rear of the cemetery, as a joint project by the Kia Kaha teams and members of the Galatea community.
- Fifteen copper beech trees were planted along Cemetery Road, and nine maple trees within the cemetery.



The Kia Kaha Whakatāne programme is made possible through Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) investment to provide urgent economic relief for the workforce, particularly those who have lost jobs through COVID-19.
