# Vaccine pass requirements for Council facilities

The Whakatāne District is currently at the red setting of the COVID-19 Protection Framework, known as the traffic light system. At red, we need to take action to protect staff, vulnerable communities and our health system from COVID-19.



The Whakatāne District Mayor Judy Turner and Councillors voted 10-1 in favour of vaccine pass requirements for entry to all Council facilities from Monday, 13 December **excluding** parks, reserves, playgrounds, cemeteries, Murupara swimming pool, Whakatāne and Murupara Refuse Transfer Stations, and public toilets that are not inside a Council facility.

#### MURUPARA POLICE UPDATE

Kia ora koutou

With Christmas quickly approaching, we all need to be extra vigilant on our roads and in our communities. If you see something suspicious, please report it.

We've seen a rise in home burglaries in the Murupara area recently — make sure you lock your house, including windows, securely when you're not there. It's also a really good idea to make note of the serial numbers on your personal equipment and mark or identify your belongings. We have kits available at the Police station to help you mark your things if you need one.

We've received complaints from several community members about online fraud through social media such as Facebook Marketplace. Please be aware of people mailing items, selling counterfeit items, requesting advanced payments and creating fake accounts – remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Visit the NZ Police website and follow the links to learn more about how to protect yourself.

If you're drinking, don't drive – the risk is too high. Alcohol and/or drugs are a factor in about a third of all fatal crashes and the consequences are devastating for everyone involved, including your friends and whānau. In the past five years, more than 6,500 crashes resulting in injury included alcohol as a factor. 1,584 people were seriously injured, and 389 people were killed. If you're going to drink, plan how you're getting home before you head out to avoid making a bad decision later. There's always an alternative to drink driving.
