DOG REGISTRATION TIME

It's time to renew your dog registration! Register your dog(s) on or before Friday, 31 July 2020 and receive a discounted fee. Registrations paid after the 31 July 2020 will be charged the full fee.

You can pay online via bank transfer or credit card, in person at Whakatāne Civic Centre or Murupara Service Centre, or post a cheque.

Remember, it's much cheaper in the long run to pay \$58/83 per dog than pay a \$300 fine for each unregistered dog.

Dog exercise areas include: Fire Station Reserve, Miro Drive Reserve, Ngatimanawa Road Reserve, River Edge Reserve, Taniwha Park / Roy Hardy Reserve and Wingate Park.

Dogs are prohibited at all times at Rimu Road Reserve, Service Centre Reserve and Lake Aniwhenua Reserve (north of Jetty Road) in Galatea.

Murupara water supply update

Whakatāne District Council regularly tests

Murupara's water supply, which is untreated and high-quality water. Recently, testing recorded higher than normal levels of a contaminant in the supply. There was unanimous agreement with Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Manawa, Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Whare, Marae chairpersons (Painoaiho, Rangitahi, Moewhare), Kaumatua Pem Bird, the Murupara Community Board, Mayor Judy Turner, Council Chief Executive Steph O'Sullivan, Council water treatment staff, and other community leaders, to carry out a dosing of the system. This was completed after the community had been notified and took place on Monday, 25 May.

The results of initial testing following the dosing and flushing of the system showed success in reducing the contaminant to low levels. While there was a slight rise in the contaminant, subsequent samples taken on 3 and 4 June have shown an improvement throughout the network.

Further to this, Council has also undertaken further maintenance at the reservoirs and holding tank to ensure they are sealed to prevent any insect or small animal entering the network through these above ground facilities.

Testing will continue. If the results continue to show increasing levels of the contaminant, the Council will continue to korero with community leaders and the wider community about the water supply.

The Council is committed to working with the Murupura community to ensure we collectively manage the water supply system to keep the community healthy and safe.

Family harm incidents continue to be a big problem, and are getting more serious with assaults.

People riding motorbikes on Black Road Forestry block continues to be a problem. CCTV and security are increasing in this area to catch these offenders, who will be prosecuted.
