

Work scheduled to complete Lake Āniwaniwa repairs

Later this month, Whakatāne District Council will begin further repairs on the ablution block at Lake Āniwaniwa Reserve. The facilities were senselessly destroyed by vandals late last year and this phase will complete the remediation work.

Contractors will be on-site from Monday, 14 September to paint the wood work and resurface the toilet block floors, improve the shower facilities and replace the concrete surrounds.

During the repairs, the toilet block will be closed but portaloos will be available. Everything is due to be completed by 12 October in time for Labour weekend.

Don't treat us like rubbish

A yellow-lid recycling bin audit is on its way to Murupara – please only recycle the 'big six' items, or your yellow-lid bin won't be collected.


Whakatāne District Council ran a campaign last year to help clean up kerbside recycling, because people continue to contaminate their bins with un-recyclable materials. Unfortunately, the Council's rubbish and recycling contractor, Waste Management NZ Ltd, reports the level of contamination hasn't really changed.



The on-street audit, taking place on 13 October, will identify offending bins and leave them unemptied on the street. The unemptied bins will have a green sticker attached to them identifying the non-recyclable products. The trucks will not return to stickered bins, but they will be emptied two weeks later if the non-recyclable goods and sticker have been removed.

Yellow-lid kerbside recycling bins should only contain clean paper, cardboard, tins, cans and plastics grades 1 and 2. For plastics, check the recycling symbol - which is usually on the bottom of the product - and only put plastics 1 and 2 in the yellow-lid bins.

Attention SuperGold bus users

To enjoy SuperGold free travel on the bus you will need the new Bee Card. There are three ways to get your Bee Card:

- Order your Bee Card online at beecard.co.nz to have your card posted to you for free. You will need to enter your SuperGold card details.
- 2. Collect a Bee Card from a bus driver.
- Collect a card from a Bay of Plenty Regional Council office; 5
 Quay Street, Whakatāne or Corner Fenton and Pukaki Streets,
 Rotorua.

To get your free bus travel you will need to have your SuperGold travel concession loaded on to a **registered Bee Card**.

You can register your Bee Card and add your SuperGold details online at **beecard.** co.nz.

If you don't have access to the internet, call into a Regional Council office and they will help set up your account and add your SuperGold concession. You will need to bring your SuperGold card with you.





USING YOUR BEE CARD

Instead of showing your SuperGold card to the bus driver, you will use your Bee Card to tag on and tag off the bus using the card readers by the door. When you tag on with your Bee Card the readers will recognise you as a SuperGold customer and you will travel free from 9am on weekdays and all day weekends and public holidays. Prior to 9am on weekdays you will be charged the concession fare.
