The submission period opens on Monday 8 August 2022 and closes at 5pm on Friday, 16 September 2022.

Submissions lodged electronically do not require a signature. Submissions must be in the format of Form 5 of the Resource Management Act and state whether or not you wish to be heard on your submission. Copies of the submission form are available from the Council offices and libraries, and Council's website as detailed.

Once the closing date for submissions has passed, all submissions received will be summarised and made available for public inspection. Persons wishing to support or oppose any of these submissions will be entitled to do so. Council will then hold a hearing for the Proposed Plan Change to consider submissions that have been lodged and issue decisions on the matters raised. Anyone who makes a submission and indicated that they wish to be heard will have the right to attend the hearing and present their submission.

On receiving notice of a decision on their submission, any person who disagrees with, or is dissatisfied with, the decision made, may appeal the decision to the Environment Court for further consideration.

The proposed plan change becomes fully operative after the Council has made its decision and all appeals, if there are any, have been resolved.
