

New mobile service vans to connect remote communities

We're excited to let you know about He Waka Hono Hapori Community Connections and Outreach Project! The vans, funded by the Department of Internal Affairs Better Off Funding package, will be ready by the end of 2024.

The vans will act as mobile outreach hubs, offering information and support to residents who may struggle to access physical Council buildings. They will be equipped with laptops, free Wi-Fi, printers, and other adaptable technology as well as access to library borrowing services and some Council services.

It is intended that one van will serve the northern areas of the district, including Rangitāiki, Tāneatua, Waimana, Ōhope and Whakatāne Community Boards. The other van will serve the southern areas of the district, from the Matahina Dam inland, including the Murupara Community Board areas and Te Urewera, Murupara, and Galatea-Waiohau Subdivisions.

The vans are expected to arrive by June 2024 and will undergo a special fit out before being ready to service the communities.

We're preparing the draft 2024-34 Long Term Plan.

Formal public consultation begins 12 March.

EDGECUMBE THORNTON SHARED PATHWAY

Work will soon start on the first stage of a much anticipated shared pathway between Edgecumbe and Thornton. The project has been a long-standing aspiration for the local Edgecumbe community and is part of the wider vision of creating walking and cycling loops across the Whakatāne District.

Whakatāne District Council secured \$900,000 from the Department of Internal Affairs Better Off Funding package to complete the shared pathway, which will enhance the accessibility and enjoyment of the scenic route for people of all ages and abilities.

The first stage will begin at the Edgecumbe Squash and Tennis Club and end at the Edgecumbe Skatepark. The route of the remaining pathway to Thornton is yet to be confirmed.
