7 REPORTS

7.1 July – December 2024 Six Monthly Climate Change Update

Refer pages 9-16 of the agenda.

Manager Strategy and Policy and Strategic Analyst, G Mischefski-Gray, spoke to the report, which covered progress on targets and actions outlined in the climate strategy. The report featured a new and simplified format, with a correction noted for an emissions target typo. Key actions included successful climate change workshops and the development of a decarbonisation plan. The report also introduced a climate assessment in the council reporting template.

Correction: The emissions target in the Climate Change Pathway 2024-27 as outlined in the report.

Manager Resource Consent discussed the national environmental stages and the fast-tracking bill driven by central government. The submission supports most subjects with minor changes and expresses concerns about the detail consent process. Key points included the following:

- Impact on emergencies and natural hazards.
- Client history and consent decisions, and
- The potential impact on relationships with Iwi.
