Whakatāne District **Elections 2025**

The 2025 Whakatāne District Council elections are coming Saturday, 11 October 2025. The candidates are locked in, the electoral roll is closed, and now it's time to get ready to vote!

From 9 September, you'll have the power to shape who leads your community for the next three years, choosing from a mayor, 10 councillors across six wards (including three Māori wards), and 24 community board champions. Plus, you'll weigh in on a poll about the future of Māori ward representation.

Your voting pack lands in your mailbox from 9 September with everything you need – voting papers, candidate info, and your guide to making it count. Voting closes at 12 noon on election day, so **stand for something** and make your mark on the future of the Whakatāne District.

From planning to action in Matatā



Whakatāne District Council is introducing a three strikes system to help manage increasing contamination in recycling and greenwaste bins. If your bin is found to contain incorrect items, you'll receive two warnings. After a third strike, your bin may be removed for three months.
