The New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) represents a relevant aspect of the public interest¹, and also has an interest in Plan Change 1 (PC1) that is greater than the interest held by the general public. This interest specifically relates to the provision for temporary military training activities (TMTAs) within the proposed Awatarariki Debris Flow Policy Area.

NZDF undertakes TMTA as part of its function of maintaining the nation's security, maintaining NZDF operational capacity and providing for the well-being, health and safety of communities. TMTA can include a range of activities, from office/classroom based activities to large scale military exercises, and might involve search and rescue operations, infrastructure support (such as deployment of water purification and supply facilities as used in the aftermath of the Canterbury earthquakes), bomb deactivation training, small construction tasks, weapons firing, personnel movement etc. They may be undertaken over a period of days or weeks, on an intermittent or continuous basis, and during both day and night.

The key matter of importance to NZDF is the appropriate provision for TMTA within the Whakatāne District Plan. NZDF is concerned that the changes proposed in PC1 may unduly restrict its abilities to carry out TMTA in the area affected by PC1. As currently drafted, the rules under Section 18.2.6 would mean TMTA within the 'high risk' area is a prohibited activity and TMTA within the 'medium risk' area would require resource consent. NZDF does not consider these restrictions are necessary for TMTA and TMTA should fall within the

identified exceptions to the rule. TMTA are by their nature temporary and to provide for them in the Awatarariki Debris Flow Policy Area would be consistent with the proposed Policy 19. TMTA are also similar in nature to the exemptions proposed under PC1, in that they are generally transitory and do not involve the erection of permanent structures. TMTA are currently provided for elsewhere in the district under Chapter 11 – General Provisions of the Whakatāne District Plan.
