Returning home:

Remember to apply for rates remission

Since the 6 April flood, rate payments have been postponed on all yellow-stickered properties across the Whakatāne District.

Owners of affected properties have received letters explaining the process of rates postponement and remission (which effectively means that rates will not be charged for the time a house was unable to be occupied as a result of the flood and repair process).

Owners are reminded that they need to let the Whakatāne District Council rates team know when their house repairs are finished, so that the rates remission can be applied.
