Welcome Home packs

Have you returned to your repaired, yellow-stickered home? The Recovery Office would like to say "Welcome Home" with a flexi-tub of household goodies.



"We know there are now over 50 families back home and with the number of properties that are in the pipeline to be finished in coming weeks, we felt it was a good time to launch a welcome home pack to mark this significant milestone in the recovery process," says District Recovery Manager Barbara Dempsey.

From Wednesday 1 November, call in, with ID, to Te Tari Āwhina (affected Edgecumbe and Plains residents) or to the Customer Services counter at Whakatāne District Council (affected Tāneatua/ Rūātoki residents), register that you're back home, and receive your Welcome Home pack — which will be available until all residents are back in their repaired homes.

New hours at Te Tari Āwhina

Te Tari Āwhina at Edgecumbe Library has been the hub of flood recovery services, 6-days a week since early-May. Initially up to seven partner agencies were operating from Te Tari Āwhina, returning to their usual bases as the demand for their services has reduced.

The Liveable Homes Project, which is close to completing all of its builds, is now based out of the Recovery Office at Whakatāne District Council (tel. 306 0500).

- Open Monday to Friday, 9am-2pm (unless open later for advertised events)
- Recovery Navigator's Tuesday to Friday, 10am-noon
- Internal Affairs (grant funding) every second Tuesday (next visit 7 November), 1-3pm

Inland Revenue info session – 9 November


