Demolition works on College Road to start soon

Bay of Plenty Regional Council has announced Shane Moore Services (SMS) Ltd as the contractor to carry out demolition works on College Road in Edgecumbe.

Minister of Civil Defence visits Eastern Bay

The Regional Council's Project Manager, Peter Hay, says the contractor's staff will be visiting the site shortly, but the large-scale work was likely to start post-Christmas.

"The properties were all purchased and signed over to Council in October and we acknowledged that milestone with a small blessing. But it isn't a simple sale and purchase for many former-landowners, so we are working with them to allow for final visits or blessings of individual houses.

"Work on the design of the stopbank continues. A couple of community-representatives sit with us on the team to work on initial designs and we have appreciated their involvement. We hope to be in a position to share those designs with the wider community shortly."

Mr Hay also reminds locals and other College Road users that they should keep clear of the fenced off areas and be mindful of machinery and trucks operating during the removal process and subsequent work.

BUILDING CONSENTS FOR FLOOD REPAIRS

- REMEMBER IT'S LIKE FOR LIKE

It's great to see so many people taking up Whakatāne District Council's offer of free building consent for repairs to flood-damaged homes. Remember, the free consent is for physical repairs or replacement of items 'like for like'.

The replacement of fireplaces seems to be a hot topic! If you're putting in a much larger fireplace, or one that's a different combustion source, you'll need to provide an amendment to the consent. In that case, the building team will assess the amendments to see what technical inspections are required and whether there will be any additional cost.

Council's free consent offer doesn't cover changing the 'footprint' of your house during the repair, i.e. major remodelling or adding on an extension.
