WE'RE BRINGING A

SAFER TRAVEL ROUTE TO YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

WE'LL SOON BE STARTING CONSTRUCTION ON SEVERAL MAJOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS ON COLLEGE ROAD.

- Four new raised courtesy pedestrian crossings, one on Rata Ave and three along College Road for easier access and crossing points
- New wider footpath from Rata Ave to past Edgumbe College
- New kerb and channel along all new footpaths
- Additional stormwater along the length of the project
- New parking layout, creating additional parking spaces from the Pre-school to Edgumbe College
- New entrance ways to all schools

Weather dependent, the works will take place in three stages between Monday, 22 May and Friday, 29 September 2023.
