Social Housing Review



The Whakatāne District Council has undertaken a review of its Social Housing activities, with the aim of ensuring that existing and future tenants receive the best possible service. The review has been prompted by changes in the way central government funds social housing and looks to identify ways of enhancing the delivery of social housing for the benefit of our community. In future, Government support for social housing will be channelled through Community Housing Providers and as a result, opportunities are developing that could lead to better and more affordable housing for those of our District most in need.

We are also expecting a large increase in the number of older people in our District and an increasing issue of housing affordability. Both are key issues which the future provision of social housing will need to address. Through the review, we have identified six possible options for the future of social housing. OPTION 1 – STATUS QUO		
Continue to manage our existing housing units and deliver the same standard of service.		
OPTION 2 – UPGRADE DELIVERY		
Upgrade our units to modern standards and investigate developing more units. This would require an increase in rent charges, or additional cost to ratepayers.		
OPTION 3 – OUTSOURCE MANAGEMENT		
Continue to own the units, but outsource the management to an appropriate alternative provider. The number and quality of units would probably stay the same.		
OPTION 4 – ESTABLISH A TRUST		
Establish a Trust with other people/organisations and sell or transfer our units to the Trust. The Trust may be eligible to access central government funding and therefore could look at expanding the portfolio.		
OPTION 5 – COMMUNITY HOUSING PROVIDER		
Seek improved and more affordable social housing, through ownership by an approved Community Housing Provider COUNCIL'S PREFERRED OPTION		
OPTION 6 – EXIT SOCIAL HOUSING		
Exit the social housing market and sell the existing units on the open market.
