LANDING ROAD ROUNDABOUT Renewal and upgrade

What's happening?

We're renewing and upgrading the Landing Road roundabout. This involves creating a new road layout, major road surface renewal work and safety improvements.

When is it happening?

Work has started, and the majority will be completed before Christmas. Further works on the footpaths and landscaping will be completed in early 2024.

Work will be completed between 7am-5pm Monday-Saturday.

What roads will be closed?

A section of Hinemoa Street (between the roundabout and Victoria Ave) and the Landing Road Extension (past the rowing club) will be closed from September.

Affected residents and rowing club members have been given access permits.

What delays can I expect?

Plan ahead.

Expect delays.

The work involved in this renewal and upgrade is substantial. There will be increased delays and interruptions to normal travel times. We'll do everything we can to minimise disruption to traffic, including ensuring traffic flow is maintained (i.e. no stop/go).
