Major road works starting soon

Expect delays. Plan ahead. Ka takaroa te haere - me whakariterite

There'll be significant delays through the area and interruptions to normal travel times, however there won't be any stop/go traffic management in place. We encourage everyone to use this time now to plan ahead. Consider alternative modes of transport such as biking or walking.

Landing Road bridge will remain **OPEN** during these works.

We'll do everything we can to minimise disruption to traffic and ensure the flow of traffic is maintained.
